Dear Ms. Higginbotham,

I am delighted to submit my application for Cocoa's City Manager Position. Cocoa is experiencing a renaissance and I want to help it succeed. Cocoa's City Manager is *the* link between the elected leadership of the city and the professional staff who are the engine of execution.

Cocoa needs a City Manager to vigorously, transparently, and fairly implement the intent of our elected Council within legal and financial constraints. The City Manager's ability to lead, inspire, and grow the competencies of a team of city staff will determine whether Council's initiatives take root and flourish. The City Manager's assertiveness, backbone, and steadfastness will impact Council's ability to grapple with and resolve significant issues. As Cocoa embraces change, the City Manager can also serve as a resource to Council by identifying professional and technical innovations that improve and increase our solution sets. I am deeply qualified to do all this and more.

Cocoa needs a City Manager with the energy, persistence, decisiveness, grit, trustworthiness, creative thinking, fiscal responsibility, and diplomatic skills that I bring. There is no roadmap for where Cocoa is going next, but I have trained to thrive and help others succeed where there is no roadmap.

Throughout my career I have developed a versatile skillset that correlates directly with what Cocoa's next City Manager must bring to the table. At every point in my career I have met challenges directly and innovatively, while inspiring trust. This is because I genuinely enjoy coming up a learning curve, struggling with a problem, and building consensus for practical solutions. Likewise, I am fair, logical, transparent, and communicate directly. Just as importantly, I am comfortable both leading and taking direction.

I led teams of international students on multi-day outback treks and search and rescue missions in the mountains of New Mexico, with only terrain maps and a compass. As a consultant, I learned database design on my own and invented a process to increase my team's data capture efficiency and accuracy; my client and competitors adopted it as well. Through assertiveness and diplomacy I led antagonistic CIA and DIA intelligence officers from competition to collaboratively articulating how they could solve emerging intelligence issues with cutting-edge technologies. I briefed these findings to our most senior intelligence leaders, National Intelligence Officers, and the Joint Chiefs. Our

efforts helped win Congressional budget approvals to fund technology shifts that directly prepared U.S. forces for the successful mission against Osama bin Laden in 2011. I won numerous competitive proposals by designing teams, work plans, deliverables, and competitive budgets. While managing 15 direct reports and simultaneous projects, I delivered them on time and on budget, providing high value to the client while making a profit for my company. I was one of the firm's first recipients of the Values in Practice award. I became the "hiring model" for new hires in my team: "We need more Jennys. Find more like her and hire them!"

After moving from D.C. and starting a family, I started a company to invent and create dress shoes that professional women could wear comfortably all day. Corporate structure, strategic hires, global supply chain, freight forwarders, trademarks, intellectual property law, leather finishes, biomechanics of the foot, production, anthropometric data, earned media, e-commerce, sales promotion. . . were just the tip of the iceberg. And my shoes nailed it! I grew based on repeat customers both online and in 35 stores across the county.

Recently in Cocoa, I served as campaign manager for a political campaign that won 65% of the vote against the incumbent -- the first such successful challenge in at least 30 years. When I began, I had no idea how to run a campaign, but I knew I could learn quickly. I ordered a book, studied the issues and Cocoa's situation, researched campaigns I liked, formed a plan, and got cracking. I helped our team find its strengths and rhythms in working together. Our campaign was singled out in Florida Today: "Winners, Competent Campaign. . . . an energetic and beautifully crafted campaign that should be studied by those seeking local office."

I now serve as the Chair of Cocoa's Sustainability Advisory Committee. I inherited this position from two prior chairs, and took it on at a time when the City had become reluctant to move forward. I rebuilt the morale of the committee, recruited new members, kept our focus, researched proper application of Sunshine Laws, persistently required collaboration from city staff, and built momentum. Today we have a plan to address Cocoa's unique, diverse challenges and a committee geared to drive forward.

In closing, I bring national-level government and business experience that translates, good judgment, positive energy, fiscal responsibility, negotiation and diplomatic skills, an analytic and innovative problem-solving focus, an approachable leadership style, persistence, assertiveness, grit, and abiding regard for democracy in a Council Manager context. I have already invested in Cocoa's future. I have demonstrated an ability to help Council get things done, even with no official power. Though I may be a surprising candidate, I think I am Cocoa's best and brightest way forward.
