

Section 6. - Deputy Mayor; Senior Member of Council.

(a) The city council, annually, at the organizational meeting held on the eighth day after the date of the general election, or at the second regular meeting held in November if there is no municipal general election, shall elect from among its members, a deputy mayor. In the absence, incapacitation, or disqualification of the mayor, or upon the mayor's refusal to act as directed by the city council, the deputy mayor shall perform the duties of the mayor.

(b) In the absence, incapacitation, disqualification, or upon the refusal to act as directed by the city council, of both the mayor and the deputy mayor, the senior member of the city council shall perform the duties of the mayor. The senior member of the city council shall be that council member, other than the mayor and deputy mayor, with the longest continued service. In the event of equal continued service, the individual receiving the most votes at the general election is the senior member.
