WHEREAS, it is also important to remember those civil rights pioneers like Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. and Rosa Parks, who broke down racial barriers and inspired our nation, as well as the Reverend C.K. Steele of Tallahassee, Harry and Harriette Moore of Brevard County, Reverend H.K. Matthews of Pensacola, and other leaders who worked to promote justice and equal rights for all Americans regardless of race; and

WHEREAS, as we celebrate Black History Month, we recognize the many contributions of African-Americans to our country and recommit to being a nation of opportunity and hope for every citizen.
